The difficulty of obtaining nurses here, the board felt, was not peculiar to Prince Rupert but was experienced generally.

The board discussed the possibility of making conditions more attractive for nurses. It thought that a tennis court might be one effective means of making the surroundings more pleasant and the grounds committee was asked to look into this possibility.

A letter from the Prince Rupert Labor Council, R. H. Adcock, secretary, expressed concern at the turnover of nurses here, suggesting that, if sufficient remuneration was the only difficulty, that might simply be rectified in view of the financial condition of the hospital. The Labor Council will be thanked by the board for the interest it has shown and will be advised that nurses' salaries here are equal to, if not better than, those being paid elsewhere in the prov-


