IS BELIEVED TO HAVE PERISHED

Steps are being taken to salvage and bring into Prince Rupert for repairs the Canadian Fishing Co.'s fish packer Point Lambert which was wrecked recently on Truro Island north of Port Simpson and whose skipper, Capt. Arthur Bolton, is missing and presumed lost. The wreck has been examined by searchers which located it. It is believed that Bolton, who was the sole member of the crew, may have fallen overboard. The hope that he might still be safe after getting away in a life boat has been just about abandoned.

Emmerson Place Residence Sold

The well known residential property on Emmerson Place for years owned by M. M. Stephens and now occupied by F. N. Good has been sold by T. H. Johnson of Victoria to J. L. McEwen. The purchaser is now engaged in making improvements to the property which he will occupy later.

PROTEST MADE BY PARENT-TEACHERS

The Prince Rupert Parent-Teachers' Association has written to the Department of Education at Victoria, presenting a resolution protesting at the proposal to remove Booth Memorial High School from the list of accredited High Schools. Reasons for the removal of Prince Rupert from the accredited list, as given by Inspector of Schools B. Thorsteinsson to the Daily News in a recent interview, the Association contends, do not justify the proposal. School conditions have not deteriorated. The library has become more valuable. School grounds are being improved. More credits are being extended. Rights of teachers, parents and pupils should be considered, the Parent-Teachers' resolution contends, and any change should at least not be made this year.

Children Buying War Savings Stamps

Pupils of the public schools of Prince Rupert continue their thrifty custom of regularly buying war savings certificates. The savings in April were quite substantial. By schools they amounted as follows: King Edward, \$189; Borden Street, \$168; Conrad Street, \$78.75.
