For those not well acquainted with CO-OPS, here are a few facts:

- 1. CO-OPS first started in England a little over 100 years ago. Today the British CO-OPS have over 8,000,000 members.
- 2. Each CO-OP is owned and controlled by the people of the community it serves.
- 3. Membership is open to all.
- 4. Each member has one vote only in the control of the business.
- 5. Capital is supplied by the members who purchase shares.
- 6. Sales are made at regular market prices.
- 7. At the end of each year financial statements are made up to show the results of the year's operations. Any net surplus is the property of the members and is distributed IN PROPORTION TO PATRONAGE. In the last analysis this means that members get their goods at cost.
- 8. CO-OPS are neutral in race, religion, politics.
