LOOKING OVER MAJOR LEAGUES

In the National League the league-leading Brooklyn Dodgers increased their lead yesterday by whitening the New York Giants. In the only game scheduled the Dodgers trounced the Giants 2-1.

In the American League the Chicago White Sox hammered out a victory over the Detroit Tigers and narrowed the Tigers' lead to one game. Score was 1-0.

In the International loop Newark Bears swept a doubleheader with Toronto Maple Leafs, winning both games, 2-1. Meanwhile, the Montreal Royals swamped Syracuse Chiefs 5-0. The game between the Jersey City Giants and the Buffalo Bisons and the doubleheader between Baltimore Orioles and Rochester Red Wings were postponed.
