



Building Permits Total \$12,875

OPPORTUNITIES aber FOR VETERANS Building permits issued by the City Engineer's office in October totalled \$12,875, the majority covering small repairs to existing structures. Total value of permits issued so far this year is \$197,529. Value of permits for the similar period last year was \$200,405.

Largest single item on October's list was a permit for \$3,450 for repairs to the Wallace Block issued to L. M. Felsenthal.
