**Strange Scene In Coroner's Court**

CHESTER, Eng., 9.—A mad wife clutches her husband's throat in an attempt to strangle him. The husband, grabbing her wrist, pulls her around so that she falls on one knee. Many times Peggy O'Dare, 42-year old repertory actress, had played that scene as the mad wife in the stage version of "Jane Eyre." This time the scene was enacted in court at the request of a coroner. For this was an inquest on Peggy O'Dare, Margaret Courtney in private life, who died in mental hospital suffering from "acute confusional mental disturbance." The court drama was staged by Alan Tilvern, the stage husband, and June Morton, stand-in for Miss O'Dare, to help the coroner decide if the stage fall had anything to do with the death. He ruled that it hadn't and that death was from "natural causes."
