FUNERAL OF JOE BOULET FRIDAY

Funeral has been arranged to take place tomorrow morning with high requiem mass at the Church of the Annunciation for Joseph Boulet, one of Prince Rupert's real pioneer citizens, whose death occurred Monday at the Prince Rupert General Hospital after an illness of some length. Mr. Boulet's residence here had dated back to 1907 when he arrived to assist in the clearing of the townsite. He had come to this city from the Yukon where he went in the "Gold Rush" days. Engaged in mining, he had spent a few years at Anxox during his long residence in this area. Mr. Boulet was 76 years of age and a native of Montmagne, Quebec. He has one brother at Montmagne and one in Montreal and a sister in New Hampshire.
