

76 MILLION IN BONDS FRIDAY

OTTAWA, April 30 (P)—Total sales of Eighth Victory Loan bonds on Friday amounted to \$76,603,400, boosting to \$365,027,250 the cumulative total for the first five days of the drive, National War Finance headquarters announced.

Friday's total was \$1,000,000 more than the same day in the previous loan but the cumulative total was about \$3,500,000 behind the aggregate at the same stage of the Seventh Loan campaign.

Total for the B.C.-Yukon area on Friday was \$23,274,900, or 39 percent of quota. The west coast command of the Navy was 130 percent of quota while the air force touched 100 percent.

George Formby, popular British screen, stage and radio star, having already played army and air force starring parts, goes naval in "Bell Bottom George" which is the feature picture at the Capital Theatre for the first of this week.

George, as usual, manages to get into all kinds of chucklesome troubles but for one sequence, in the character of a would-be-matrotel, he manages to do all the right things for once, and in a romantic mood, too. The setting is a modern restaurant much featured at an unnamed port by service men and their heart-throbs, smartly decorated and boasting a good band and dance floor.

Here George brings the attractive young Wren, played by Anne Firth, who has stolen his heart but has yet to be won. However, in the very next sequence he ruins his prospects of getting into the Navy.
