Northwest Rebellion Broke Out March 26, 1885, Ending Three Months Later

Sixty years ago the mutterings price. prairie halfbreeds in the Northwest Territories burst into the fury of revolt and, with the battle of Duck Lake on March 26. 1885, the Northwest Rebellion

In three months of isolated volunteers, Northwest Mounted Police and members of Eastern Canadian regiments, died. Losses among their opponents, the Indians and halfbreeds, probably were about the same, although no detailed count appears to have been kept by the rebel leaders.

The campaign had fantastic contrasts. Gen. Frederick Middleton, a precise, slow-moving British officer, led an impetuous force of Eastern Canadian troops who were associated with hardriding Mounted Police and volunteers. His enemy was the quickthinking, unpredictable Louis
