TERRACE IS SEEKING HOSPITAL; HAPPY OUTINGS AT LAKELSE LAKE

The Board of Trade held its monthly meeting in the Terrace Hotel. There was a good muster of the members under the chairmanship of President Harry King.

Perhaps the most important and pressing matter which was discussed was the lack of any sort of hospital in the district to which casualties such as frequently happen in the woods and saw-mills could be brought and where they could be attended to until they could be conveyed to the hospital either at Prince Rupert or at Hazelton. Dr. Stanley Mills brought up the subject and several speakers who followed him agreed as to the urgency of the matter. A committee was formed to work on this and was urged by the chairman to find a solution to the problem as soon as possible.

In the International League, the Toronto Maple Leafs edged out the Rochester Redwings 8-7. The Montreal Royals trimmed the Buffalo Bisons 8-3, while the Jersey City Giants took a 4-2 defeat at the hands of the Newark Bears. The Baltimore Orioles gave the Syracuse Chiefs a 16-6 lacing.
