Did you know that reading ranks third on the list of leisure time pursuits of young Canadians? According to a survey conducted by sub-committee on recreation of the Canadian Youth Federation, there is a greater interest in reading than is ordinarily believed. Forty per cent of Canadian adolescents read from 5 to 15 books a year while the top 10 per cent read one book a week. If you are interested in entering the "book a week" league you will also want to know how you can obtain a continuous supply of good books. They can be obtained right here in Prince Rupert. The Prince Rupert Public Library has from three to 4,000 volumes of fiction and non-fiction. Many more are on order and will be on the shelves shortly. If the reading material you desire is not included in this selection, possibly you could obtain it from the Open Shelf Division of the Public Library Commission in Victoria. Upon inquiry to Victoria, full information will be forwarded to you regarding the books which are available, together with an explanation of the free library service they offer. Should a copy of "A Readers' List of Books in the Open Shelf Division" fail to satisfy your literary appetite, you could investigate the free library service offered by the Department of University Extension at the University of British Columbia. An enquiry addressed to either library will bring you a more complete explanation. British Columbia ranks high among the provinces of Canada in free library services so let's take full advantage of them.
