

Athletes going South

Eliminations in Army Track and Field Meet

Although the number of contestants was small, the Canadian army track and field meet eliminations on Acropolis Hill today produced some promising athletes to go south in a week's time to compete in the Pacific Command tournament.

Best of the 17th Coast Battery ran the mile in 4 minutes and 55 seconds to win that race and then proceeded to run a three-mile course in 17 minutes and 10 seconds to chalk up second first-place.

The 11th Coast's Adamski was runner-up in the mile event and the Soo Suds' Wambold took second in the three-mile race.

Edward Lane of 11th Battery cleared 100 yards in 11 seconds and also won the 220-yard race in 28 seconds. Schafer of the Soo Suds was runner-up in both.

The 440-yard dash was won by the Soo Suds' Sulik, while Oswald of the 17th Coast, was first in the 800-yard race.

The 11th Coast's Adamski, of the Soo Suds, took the 1000-yard race with a leap of three inches and placed second in the broad jump and shot put.

Edward Lane of 17th Coast hurled a discus 170 feet to take that race and finished first in the shot put event also.

The broad jump was won by the 17th Coast's Adamski.



TERRACE GROUP LAYS PLANS FOR CREDIT UNION

G. Campbell, an enthusiastic member of the study group. "Not only that, but credit union funds may also assist some member to take advantage of opportunities which he might be forced to pass up without such help."


Instruction in credit unionism is being received from the extension department of the University of British Columbia.
