Q. How can I make better baked potatoes?

A. Rub the skins with butter or bacon fat before baking; this prevents the skin from breaking and also imparts a delicious flavor. As soon as baked, prick the skin to allow the steam to escape and prevent soggy.

Q. How can I smooth a rough iron?

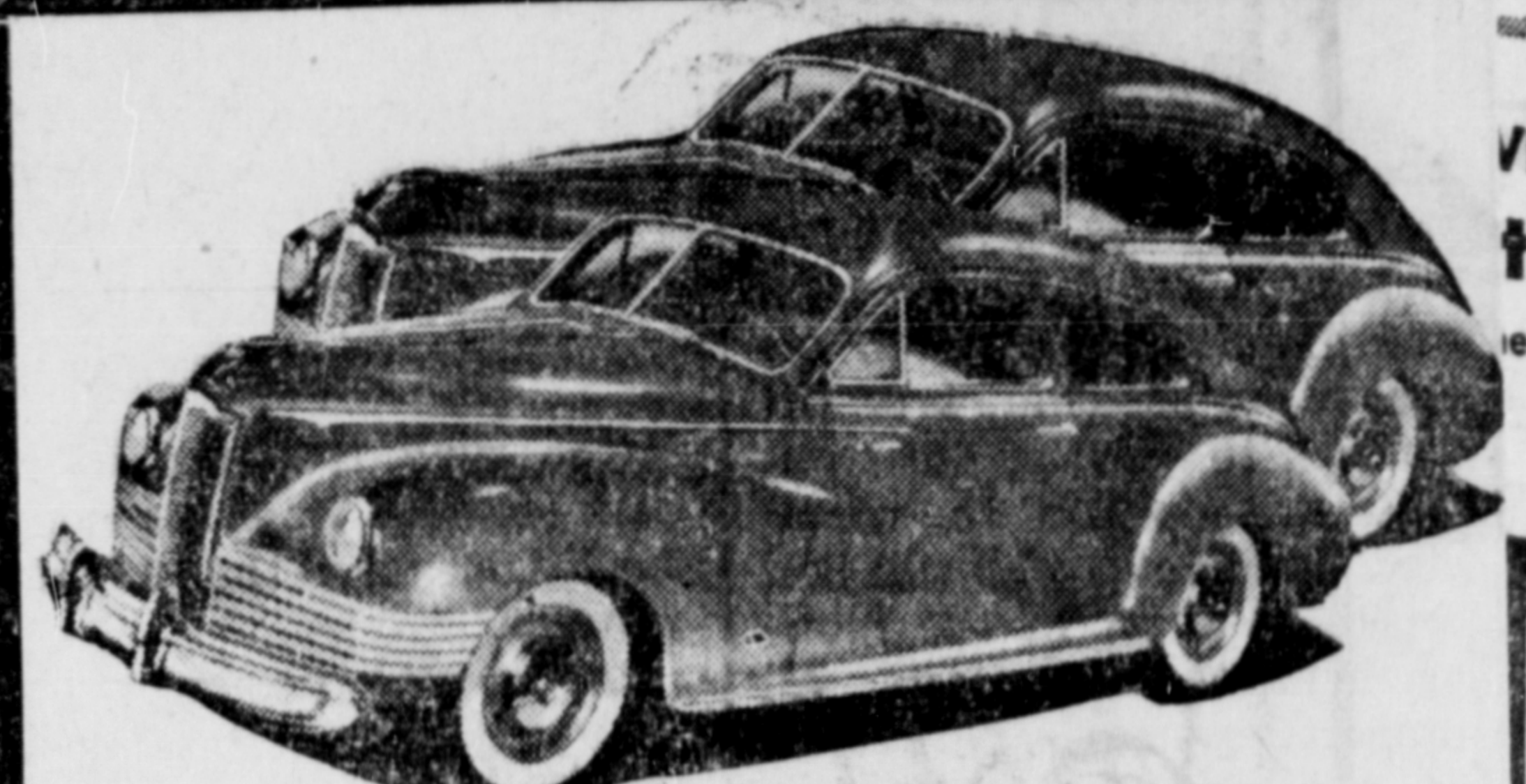
