Last rites for the late Alfred Adams, president of the Native Brotherhood of British Columbia, were held recently from St. John's Church, Massett. Scores of relatives and friends from Skidegate, Massett, Langara Island and Kitkatla filled the church to pay their final respects.

Rev. James Murray of St. John's Church officiated and the Massett choir led the singing of hymns.
