Great Lakes Teams Set Great Record

GREAT LAKES, Ill., April 20 —Three Great Lakes Naval Training Centre athletic teams have rolled up 320 victories, as against 40 defeats and two ties, in three and a half years of competition.

The Bluejacket baseball team has won 163 games while losing 23, and the 1944 team won 48 and lost two. It counted among its victims the Phils, Red Sox, Browns, Cubs, White Sox, Giants and Indians.
