STEWARDESSES ARE IMPORTANT

American Company's Finishing Courses Emphasize Brains, Charm and Efficiency for Women Personnel

ST. PAUL, Nov. 1 (C)—Young women who intend to fly high in this post-war world are attending a new kind of finishing school here.

It is called a "comportment course," and it's for the sole benefit of the stewardesses of an air lines company which intends to combine charm and efficiency in its feminine personnel.

Each student must write a thesis before graduation, a booklet in which she sets down her aims and records her daily accomplishments. Here's a sample extract from a typical thesis:

"In building a career, the development of personality is something to be planned, a personality does not fall upon you. The stewardess is successful if she possesses a good personality, and it is her greatest asset."

The writer is a stewardess newly engaged by Camille L. (Rosie) Stein, one of the best-known women executives in aviation. The booklet records the lessons she has learned in the finishing course which the line has provided so that, in meeting the public, she may be an impressive representative of the airline.

There is a physical fitness program, in which the stewardess is taught how to recondition her body if it has noticeable faults; to stand at ease with perfect balance; to walk lightly; to sit without sprawling.

Exercise isn't intended to develop bulging muscles, explains instructor Zell McConnell, an expert on the handling and developing of career girls. Its purpose, she says, is to provide flexible figures, weight control, symmetrical lines, grace, firmness of muscles, perfect proportions. She adds:

"For good posture, one must think tall, walk tall, and stretch tall."

There is a lot more to this physical fitness from the "toe tonic" and "foot arch" designed to correct foot troubles, to the "neck nip" to strengthen muscles of the neck and throat.

RAIN, WIND PREVALENT IN OCTOBER

Dark skies, heavy rainfall and high winds were all part of the weatherman's antics during October and, in rainfall at least, he set a record for the year. According to records of the government meteorological station, 13.25 inches of rain fell during the month, bringing the 10-month total to 74.48 inches. Rainfall in September was 8.8 inches, and in August, a mere .92 of an inch.

There were 47 hours of bright sunshine in 17 days, and the total hours of bright sunshine for the year so far stands at 791.6 hours. There were 899 hours of sunshine during the 10-month period last year.

Average temperature during the month was 47.9 degrees, the maximum being 64 degrees, and the minimum being 30 degrees. The 30-degree minimum on October 29 was the lowest since last March 17.

Highest wind during the month was 40 miles an hour from the southeast on October 12 and 18.

Highest barometric pressure was 30.37 inches on October 5. Lowest pressure was 29.45 inches on October 14.
