Bergman's book—aside from its friendly expertise on freshwater techniques—is of particular interest to Canadians. He devotes lengthy passages to his experiences fishing for bass in Lake Erie off Port Rowan and on the St. Lawrence off Kingston; and for native trout in the fabulous lakes of Quebec's Laurentides Park.

Bergman, as freshwater fishing expert for "Outdoor Life," has cast his flies in every part of America. But he says Laurentides Park because of its location and the management which controls it, is probably one of the outstanding brook trout fishing places in North America. He also pays special tribute to the art of left-handed Philippe Gagnon, Quebec's general superintendent of parks: "Incidentally, Mr. Gagnon is an angler of rare ability and prob-
