SHORT SPORT

An indication that Britain is giving way on broken-time payments to athletes competing in international events was given by Lord Burghley, chairman of the organizing committee for the 1948 Olympic Games, who said there should not be too much "rigidity" over this question. Presiding at the annual meeting of the Amateur Athletic Association, Lord Burghley who also is president of the International Amateur Athletic Federation, said: "What I feel on this question is that the real amateur principles must not be lost, but if there are hard cases—as I believe there are—we should consider them carefully with an open frame of mind."

Lord Burghley's remarks were made a few days after it was announced a special meeting of the I.A.A.F. would be held in London June 9-10 to discuss the controversial broken-time payment question. The special meeting was called after demands from some European countries to "settle" the problem.

Sports leaders from England, Scotland and Wales are in France to study French methods of physical recreation and sports training. The party—chosen sports leaders of the Central Council of Physical Recreation, co-ordinating council of 154 governing bodies embracing all the sports in Britain—was invited by the French ministry of education to take in a normal French advanced leaders' training course. The course embraces all sporting activities, in France, from athletics to fencing.

Twenty-two daring young women shocked their parents and made history July 13, 1747. Members of two Sussex village cricket teams, they travelled to London to play a cricket match but, according to a newspaper of the time, "the company broke in so that it was impossible for the game to be played out, some of the women being very much frightened and others hurt and it could not be finished until the morning. The result isn't known. Now, 200 years later, descendants of the original teams are to meet for a return match. The game is to be played in August at Priory Park, Chichester.

Fred Whittaker of Vancouver, who went to England to fill a centre-forward position with Notts County in the southern section, third division of the English football league, failed to impress in that position and now is a fullback on the club. He has proved a finished player in the latter spot.

Neil McDonald, local old timer, who has been in hospital for quite a few weeks, is still there but he is making as satisfactory a recovery as can be expected.

Local Hoop Talk

Although most fans might think that tonight's big battle between Macey's and Co-op will finish off the city's basketball play for the year, things might not turn out that way. Both clubs have made it clear that they won't give up the cup without a fight. Admittance will be free although a collection will be taken up which will be turned over to the Basketball Association to be used to reimburse partially any injuries suffered by players of the local league.

Following this big game will be the presentation of the trophies. It is still not definite who will make the presentation but here are a few of the suggestions that have been put forward. Norton Youngs will present the Civic Centre Trophy to the Gyo squad for winning the Junior loop. The Commander Cree Trophy may be presented to the High School Rainbirds by Lt. Eric Jones of H.M. C.S. Chatham. Either Macey's or Co-op will take the Grotto Cup from Bert Morgan on behalf of the Grotto Cigar Store. And either Mayor Nora E. Arnold or Norton Youngs will make the presentation of the Senior "A" Civic Centre Trophy to the Bo-Me-Hi Rainmakers.
