### Reminiscence— First Ball Team Here

SMITHERS — Sandy Gazely of Smithers, who opened a barber shop at the Dominion Baths on Second Avenue in 1910, was remembering the other day—the time Harvey Fraser, Jimmy McAleenan and he organized Prince Rupert's first ball team. On July 1 Ketchikan came down and everyone went to the ball game. One July 4 all the stores closed their doors and most of the population went with the ball team to enjoy the return game at Ketchikan where the game commenced as soon as the tide rolled out far enough to permit a diamond being laid out on the beach.

Sandy also had a hand in arranging one of the first boxing matches to be held in Prince Rupert. In that scrap "One Round" Nelson kayoed Pacific Coast light weight champion Johnny O'Leary.

### REMEMBERS BATTLE OF ZENARDI BRIDGE

Sandy also remembers being in the Battle of Zenardi Bridge. Two sperm whales entered the harbor when the residents of Prince Rupert were excited about the possibilities of a German attack on the coast in the First World War. The whales were said to be enemy submarines and when two men in a power boat were spotted on the Zenardi Rapids they were immediately taken to be members of a submarine crew. Sound the alarms! Dozens of well-armed citizens answered the call to action. A locomotive and one or two box cars were ordered out and without any delay the impromptu armored train went rattling down the tracks with its band of happy warriors. "Come the bridge and sure enough there were two men on the water in a power boat. The armed party waved and shouted to them in an attempt to have them come in and surrender but, instead, the boat seemed to be headed away from the tracks as though the crew were trying to escape. 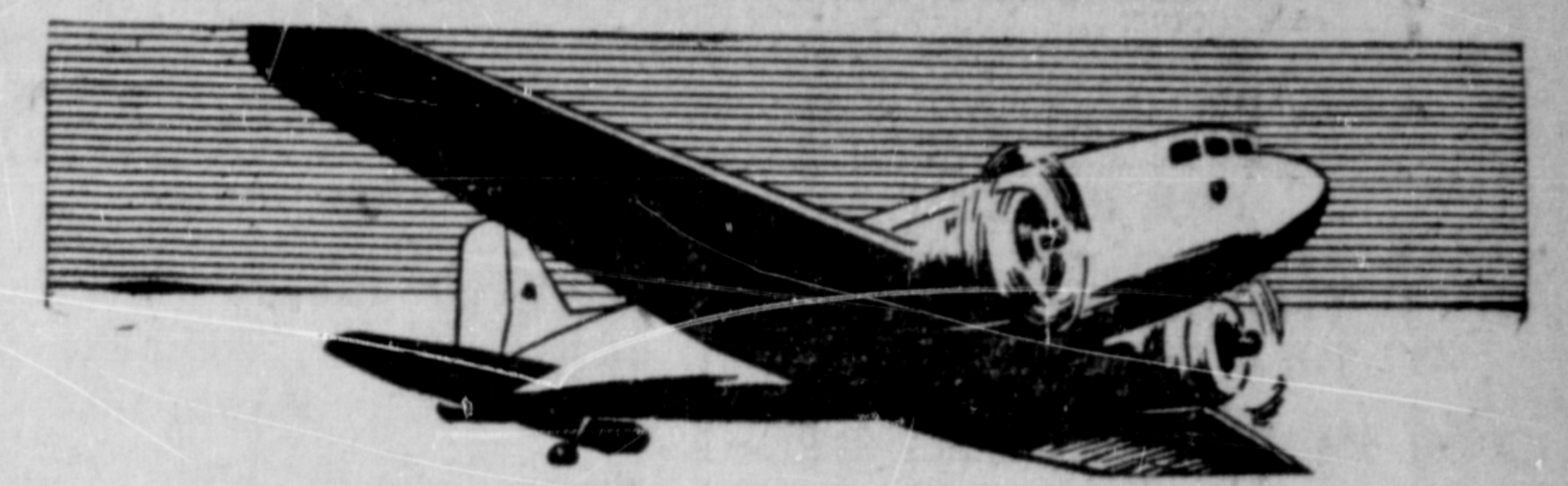
