THE CAREER of Henry Ford and the facets of ms genius touched in some way upon the lives if most of the world's peoples.

He brought into being an industry that changed course of the world and was of the select comny assured of perpetual fame.

He built more than 30,000,000 automobiles and then, with the coming of the second world war, despite a life-long hatred of war and all its ramifications, embarked upon a gigantic war production program with characteristic energy.

The building of millions of motorcars was only a part of the amazing accomplishments of the onetime obscure farm youth who became master of a vast industrial empire reaching into the far corners of the earth and one of the most colossal family fortunes the world ever has known.

His genius-and the huge fortune whose exact extent probably never will become public knowledge-took him into many fields unrelated to motorcars.

But he primarily was a mechanical wizard. He believed it was his good fortune to have lived at a time when the world was ready for the mechanical age, and he contributed to that era in huge measure.




