SCIENCE'S MOST MODERN THERAPY—Penicillin has been found to be highly effective in saving turkeys that have become infected with swine-erysipelas organism to which turkeys as well as swine are susceptible. The infection in turkeys usually attacks the flock just before marketing when the fowl are most needed. Here Dr. C. G. Grey, who conducted the experiments, injects penicillin suspended in peanut oil into the wattles of a turkey.
