



Prince Rupert Trades and Labor Council will seek to have union dues classed as deductible in making out income tax returns, thus placing members of organized labor in a position similar to professional workers whose association dues are exempt. A motion to that effect was passed at a meeting of the council last night.

A letter from Mayor Nora Arnold seeking support of the council on behalf of the Trans-Canada Highway Association advocates completion of the Mc-Bride-Jasper gap to create a northern transcontinental highway was endorsed.

A discussion took place concerning circulation of the Vancouver Daily Province in Prince Rupert and it was opinion of the meeting that renewed efforts should be made to discourage support of the paper which was described as nonunion.


