**PORK PRODUCTS UP**  
OTTAWA—The Prices and Trade Board today announced retail price increases ranging from 12 to 15 per cent on bacon and other pork products to bring them in line with recent increases in the export of bacon sold in Britain. The increase is effective tomorrow.

**PARIS—Socialist Vincent Auriol** was today elected president of France's national assembly, getting 284 votes as 284 for the Movement Republican Popular candidate, Robert Schuman. Communists helped to elect Auriol.

OTTAWA—Premier T. C. Douglas of Saskatchewan said here today that he understood the Dominion was preparing to bring forward an "altogether revised formula for working out subsidies to be paid the provinces for tax field concessions."
