
#### Speed Champ Builds Unique Racing Car

VICTORIA () - Jack Smith, former British Columbia champion auto racer, has built a Ten of his family of 12 still surfour-cylinder racing car engine vive. which he claims is of unique design. Built from a 1928 popuiar car engine-block, the design includes automatic suspension with no rear axle or differential. The machine is chaindriven. Stripped down to a piece of casting, the engine block was mounted with a cylinder head facing orposite to the exhaust. Smith believes the four-wheel independent suspension feature will aid in eliminating skidding. He estimates maximum speed will be 135 miles an hourenough to test feasibility of the design.
