LAUNCHED AT SUNNYSIDE A new Caterpiliar diesel engine left Vancouver today for installation in a 47-foot seineboat launched last Tuesday at Sunnyside Cannery by Alvin Leask of Metlaktla who designed and built the craft during the last six months. The boat will be in operation within the next few weeks.

Fellow fishermen, who have watched the boat under construction, anticipate that she will be a sound, seaworthy craft, and will show herself to be both fast and handy at her forthcoming trials.

NEW SEINER

Name of the boat remains a secret until her christening. which will take place within the next couple of weeks, after finishing work on the hull is completed

The new vessel is 47 feet long, with 15 foot beam. Her keel is of solid fir, measuring 10 by 14 inches, and her keelson,, also of fir is 10 by 16 inch dimensions. Six bilge stringers of three-by-eight-inch planking run the length of the hull. She has two-by-three inch oak ribs covered by two-inch fir planking.

The fine vessel was designed and built by Mr. Leasks, who is one of the youngest accredited boat builders on the coast. A Metlakatla native. Mr. Leask passed his mariners' tests in Vancouver in 1943 and at the same time won a scholarship in marine architecture. He was 25 years old at the time.
