"FAIR DEAL" IS WANTED

Municipalities to Declare War on Government if Goldenberg Report Unfavorable

VANCOUVER, B.C.—The executive of the Union of B.C. Municipalities have reported strong protest threatened by municipalities if the forthcoming Goldenberg report does not provide a fair deal for them. Mayor W. C. Hamilton, union president, says that municipal councils might strike against the various provincial requirements.

Premier Hart previously announced that the Goldenberg commission report on provincial-municipal financial relations will be available to the public next week.

Mayor Hamilton said that the creation of a municipal party in opposition to the old line political parties may result from dissatisfaction of the municipalities at the hands of the provincial government.

MINISTER IS AMAZED

VICTORIA, B.C.—Amazement at the threatening attitude taken by the Union of British Columbia Municipalities on municipal finances before the Goldenberg Commission recommendations were seen was voiced Wednesday by Minister of Municipalities R. C. Macdonald. Mr. Macdonald commented on reports from Vancouver which said that Mayor W. C. Hamilton of Port Alberni, president of the Union, had talked of "open revolt" by the municipalities if the Goldenberg report, expected to be made public next week, does not prove a fair deal for them.

The minister indicated that the municipalities might look for "substantial" assistance.

Local News Items

T. W. Brown, local barrister, has accepted chairmanship of the local St. John Ambulance campaign which will be held next week.

At the National Film Board Forum at the Civic Centre tonight the film to be shown will be "Life in the Sahara," "Library on Wheels" (a British Columbia picture) and "Re-Establishment Report."

W. D. Smith, M.L.A. for Atlin, returned to the city on the Coquitlam Tuesday from a visit to his constituents at Stewart and will leave this Saturday evening on the Camosun for Victoria to attend the forthcoming session of the Legislature. While at Stewart, Mr. Smith had intended visiting Premier but was unable to reach there on account of the road being blocked by heavy snow.

The irreplaceable part that daily newspapers play in everyday lives was amply illustrated during a newspaper strike in one centre when 50,000 telephone calls, representing 50% of the families in the city, flooded the newspaper office within 12 hours of the commencement of the strike.

MANSLAUGHTER CASE BAIL IS SET AT \$2,000

Fred Spitzl of Hazelton, who has been committed to appear at Assize Court here in May to answer to a charge of manslaughter in connection with the death of Mrs. Leslie H. West while on a hunting expedition near Hazelton last November 27, was granted \$2,000 bail by Judge W. E. Fisher in County Court Wednesday afternoon. Spitzl must provide one \$1,000 surety himself and two outside sureties of \$500 or one outside surety of \$1,000.

FORMER LOCAL PASTOR PASSES

Rev. W. F. Price Passes Away in Toronto at Age of Eighty-eight

Former friends in Prince Rupert will learn with regret of the death which took place recently at his Toronto home of Rev. William F. Price who was pastor of First Baptist Church here in 1928 and 1929. Eighty-eight years of age and born in Nottingham, England, he had been in the Baptist Church ministry in Canada and England for over sixty years. He and Mrs. Price had celebrated their diamond wedding anniversary last summer in Toronto.

During the First Great War Mr. Price served in England with the Y.M.C.A. War Services. He concluded his ministry in Trail where he moved after leaving Prince Rupert.

Mr. Price is survived, besides his widow, by three sons and one daughter. He lost a son in the First Great War.

ASYLUMS TO BE IMPROVED

Mental Institutions in British Columbia Will Not be Surpassed Anywhere

VICTORIA, B.C.—Provincial Secretary G. S. Pearson said last night that, as soon as materials and labor are available, the provincial government will have groups of mental institutions that will not be surpassed anywhere on the continent. He said that many of the province's institutions had outgrown their existing quarters but blamed previous administrations for neglect of buildings and war and postwar conditions that made it impossible to catch up on the needs for accommodation.

Mr. Pearson was commenting on an article in Liberty Magazine devoted to conditions in Canadian mental institutions in which Colquitz and Esson-dale mental homes were brought under fire.
