

MONTREAL - Today is the tenth birthday of TransCanada Air Lines and passengers aboard TCA planes over Canada and some parts of the United States and over the Atlantic Ocean will receive cuts of the air line's birthday cake. It will not be big enough to carry 10 candles but it will be a generous slice and it will be presented in a neat little silver-colored box with a card bearing these words: "Ten years ago today Trans-Canada Air Lines came into existence. It has grown to a system of 10,000 miles of routes spanning Canada from sea to sea, linking it with important United States centres, and flying the Atlantic to Great Britain. TCA has been proud to serve you and millions of your fellow citizens. The spirit of enterprise and responsibility which has earned your confidence will continue to be its guide in public service."


