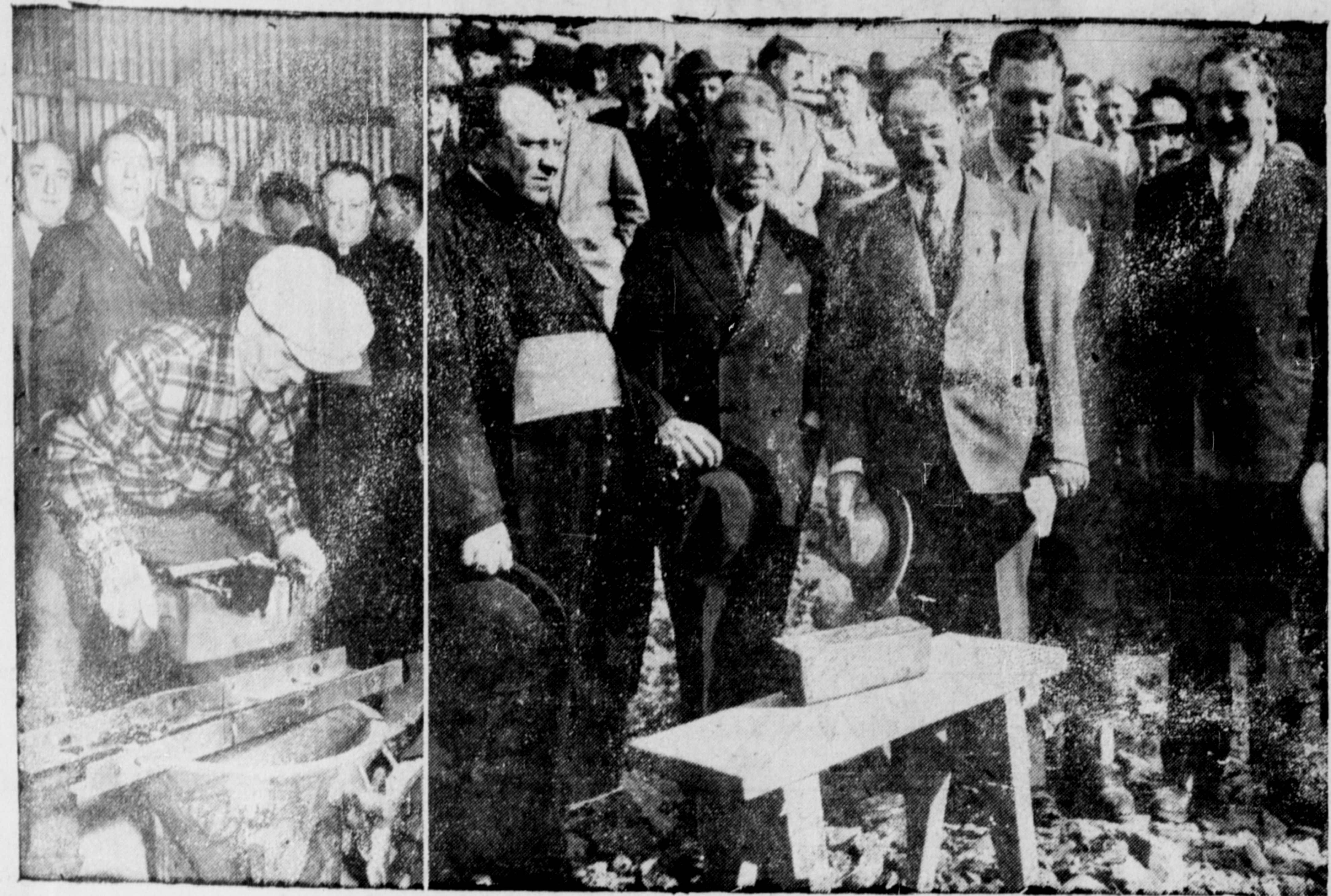

FIRST GOLD BRICK FROM NEW MINE SINCE WAR—Val d'Or, Que.—Louviciourt mine, located a few miles from here, won the distinction of being the first new mine in North America to come into production and to pour a gold brick since the end of the war. Weighing 75 pounds, the 1,000 ounces of gold form a brick of ten by four inches, worth \$30,000. A new townsite is presaged for this area with the influx of several hundred miners and their families. More than 200 guests from Toronto, Montreal, Val d'Or, Northwest Quebec and Northern Ontario were present at the pouring of the first brick. In addition the ceremonies included the blessing of the mining property by the Reverend Father R. Forest. Picture at left shows a mine worker lifting the precious brick just after it had been poured.
