The Experts Say...

Salads in Style

At this time of the year, a
sparkling fruit or vegetable salad
for luncheon or supper is as ideal
a spring tonic as a new Easter
bonnet.

Much of the attractiveness of
a salad depends upon the gar-
nish. Sliced pickles, olives, pi-
mento, eggs and highly colored
vegetables and fruits all fit the
bill, but to garnish frozen or jel-
lied salads it is necessary to line
the mould with the garnish be-
fore the jelly mixture is poured
in. First mix the jelly and when
slightly set dip pieces of garnish
in it and arrange them around
the inside of the mould. Pour in
the jellied mixture and when
firm turn out on a bed of let-
tuce leaves.

Lifting of rationing of canned
fruits has tended to leave a
quantity of unsweetened fruit on
the shelves. Home economists
have found that although solid
pack peaches haven't sugar in
them, a can of fruit packed in
this way contains more fruit
than that packed in syrup. Be-
sides, as peaches are relatively
sweet they require little sugar.
In addition, this fruit in most
cases now is selling below ceiling
prices and hence is an excellent
buy.

And here is a decorative Peach
Salad, ideal for that club lunch-
con you're planning:

Ingredients: three whole can-
ned peaches; lettuce leaves; one
half pound stoned dates; one
quarter pound chopped nut-
cats; one small bottle marachi-
no cherries.

Cut a peach in half, remove
the stone, and put lettuce leaves
with the cut side up. Mix the nut
meats, dates, and cherries, with
the cherry juice to make a stiff


Timely Recipe

Ripe Olive Pie

1/4 cup shortening or oil
3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
3 cups milk
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon paprika
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 cup cubed cooked carrots
1 cup cubed cooked turnips
1 cup cooked lima beans
3/4 cup sliced ripe olives
Pastry for top (basis 1 cup
flour)

Heat shortening or oil, add
flour and blend. Add milk, salt,
paprika and pepper, and cook
and stir until thick and smooth.
Add vegetables and ripe olives
and blend. Pour into a greased
casserole or baking dish and
cover with pastry. Bake in a hot
oven (400 degrees F.) about 25
minutes, or until crust is well
browned.
