### Special Fares To Calgary Stampede

WINNIPEG — Special railway fares will be available for those wishing to attend the Calgary Exhibition and Stampede, July 7 to 12, it is announced by R. H. Powers, vice-chairman of the Canadian Passenger Association, on behalf of the Canadian National and Canadian Pacific Railways.  
The special fares will be available from all points in Alberta, Saskatchewan, and in British Columbia east of Vancouver and Prince Rupert.
