IS INTERRED AT TERRACE

Final Rites for Late James Lee Bethurem Held Sunday

TERRACE—Following funeral service at Usk on Saturday, interment of the late James Lee Bethurem, sawmill operator and business man of Usk, whose death occurred suddenly last week, took place in Kitsumkum Cemetery here yesterday afternoon. There was a large gathering in attendance for the final rites.

Mr. Bethurem died suddenly on Friday morning at 8:45 at his sawmill. He had gone as usual to the mill which he and W. R. Adams operate and, after spending some time in the office, left to go to the washroom. As he entered this building he collapsed and died almost immediately.

Later in the morning Coroner Will Robinson, Dr. S. G. Mills and police officers proceeded from here to the scene of death and the coroner, by inquiry, established that death was due to natural causes.

Mr. Bethurem was 59 years of age. He had spent the most of his life on the Skeena River, having been at Kitselas during the steamboat days. When the railway opened he moved to Usk and established the pioneer department store there. He also served as postmaster, mining recorder and commissioner of oaths. For the last few years he had been actively engaged in the lumber manufacturing business with W. R. Adams.

Deceased leaves his widow, one daughter and stepsons and stepdaughters.
