Duke of Connaughts Are Given Hard Game by Bo-Me-Hi

New Westminster Hoopsters Baffled Locals At First But Had Defence Smashed Later

The undefeated Duke of Connaughts basketball team from New Westminster continued their winning streak by taking their ninth straight victory from the Bo-Me-Hi Rainmakers in a hard fought match in the Civic Centre last night by a score of 66 to 53. The match more than satisfied a large crowd of fans.

The local students were stumped in the first and second quarters by a very strong zone defence such as has been a thing of the past in Rupert for the last few years. It took the local lads completely by surprise and, by the time they realized what was

happening, the Dukes had an overpowering lead that allowed them to come coasting into the first half breather on the long end of a 42-22 score.
