PEACE IN INDIA

EPOCHAL HISTORY of the first magnitude is made for India with the announcement that the British government is turning over power to the leaders of India almost immediately.

It is eventful news, indeed, and it is to be noted that it appears to be meeting with satisfaction in all quarters concerned.

Most satisfactory of all to observers of the Indian scene is that both Indians and Moslems appear to be agreed on the idea of partition of Hindustan and Pakistan, something which it had not been so certain the Hindus approved of.

It was not started, as some cynical persons might suppose, by a group of paternal parents jealous of the fact that there was no day set aside for them like Mother's Day.

It was in 1010 that Mrs. John Bruce Dodd of Spokane, Washington, felt the need of a special day to honor father and "to call attention to father's place in the home, the training of the children, the safeguarding of the marriage tie, the protection of womanhood and childhood."

From this humble beginning, the day of remembrance grew to national importance gaining impetus throughout the United States and Canada.

Father's Day is being marked this year for the first time since before the war.

GRANNY'S GRAMMAR

THERE ARE AGREEMENTS pro and con every day as to whether schooling children were given in past generations was "tougher" than it is today.

If they want some confirmation of their argument, a little volume published in 1836, which may or may not be called the "good old days," back them up—at least so far as grammar is concerned.

For the more erudite, the book's title in full is "Abridgment of Murray's English Grammar with an Appendix Containing exercises in Orthography, in Parsing, in Syntax and in Punctuation, designed for the younger classes of learners."

Author Lindley Murray's idea must have been that children of the day were capable of a full "Sunday" vocabulary. There is no simplified language—and no doubt dictionaries were used often, oftener and oftener.

Rote learning was approved with lessons labeled like "Promiscuous Exercises in Etymological Parsing" suggested for memory work.

The volume has one saving grace—it is only 80 pages long.
