PIONEERS' HOME READY ON MAY 1

Opening date of the city's new Pioneers' Home will be May 1, health committee chairman Clifford Ham told city council last night. A bylaw governing the operation of the new home was presented to council but was referred back to committee for minor changes. Among main provisions of the bylaw would be appointment of a five-man board of governors, three of whom would be from city council and two from the public. The bylaw was based on a bylaw drawn up by the municipality of Surrey which also operates a home for the aged.

Excess War Clothing On Civilian Market

LONDON, (Reuters)—The British government—"probably for the time being the world's largest clothing dealer"—has poured a steady flow of surplus clothing into the civilian market, the Board of Trade Journal reported. During 1946, 34,000 tons of clothing were sold and the amount of left-over war garments is not yet exhausted.

POPULAR CONTEST

EDMONTON, Alta., (C)—The Alberta government's cooking contest so far has received more than 950 entries. The province is seeking a recipe for a "national" dish for Alberta, and the public will have until the end of April to send in entries. Most of those received so far cover the preparation of meat dishes, said D. E. C. Campbell, director of tourist promotion.
