KENYA IS SISTER SHIP OF UGANDA

H.M.S. Kenya, on a coast cruise, will stop here from August 18 to August 21, coming from Vancouver. She will leave this port for Alaska, after which she will return south. A cruiser of the "Colony" class Kenya is identical with H.M.C.S. Uganda, which has visited Prince Rupert several times, and which was taken over by Canada from the Royal Navy during the war.

CONSTRUCTION TOTAL \$16,000

Twenty-three building permits, valued at \$16,960, issued at the City Engineer's office during April, brought value of construction in Prince Rupert for the first four months of the year to \$50,792, a decrease of \$21,000 under the same period for 1946.

Construction of three houses totalling \$12,500 in cost gave a substantial boost to last month's permit list. Largest item was a \$5,500 residence being built by R. L. Eby on Fourth Avenue East. Others were a \$4,500 dwelling for T. Johnson, also on Fourth Avenue East and a \$2,500 house for A. Bergeron, Eleventh Avenue East.
