## TAKING INVENTORY OF NAZI CONCENTRATION CAMP LOOT



The prodigious task of taking inventory of the millions of dollars in Nazi loot, found in such concentration camps as Buchenwald, Dachau and others, has been assigned to the foreign exchange depository, a branch of the finance division of OMGUS. Under the direction of Col. William G. Brey, of San Francisco, General Staff Corps, the treasure that failed to conquer the world is being evaluated. It is estimated that the total value of all material housed here will run into the hundreds of millions. At right, Hagosp Gamirian, Armenian-French jeweler, employed by the U.S. as a technical expert to appraise stones and gold, is shown inspecting a bag of semi-precious and glass imitation stones. The bag had previously been inspected for diamonds. At left, Pte. John Long, Co. 1, 18th Infantry, of Chillicothe, Ohio, guards bullion in the "silver room." The total value of wire, sheets, coin, bullion in this room is estimated at about \$2,200,000.

## Art In Industry Exhibition Theme

CALCUTTA —The creation of beauty of design and presentation in Indian products through a close collaboration between artist and industrialist was the theme of an exhibition held recently by the Indian Institute of Art in Industry. A comprehensive display of applied arts and industrial design ranged from a rare collection of Tibetan articles to specimens of modern Indian plastic ware. India now has reached a stage of development when she must not only produce, but produce beautifully, and Sir Homi Modi, president of the institute, said in his opening address that beauty of design, artistic packing and imaginative salesmanship have become the needs of the hour. We do not propose to be mere copyists of western forms," he continued. "It will be our endeavor to see that the purchaser of our products will obtain something with a strong Indian appeal."

## Dail Will Continue To Talk In English

DUBLIN —The Dail has decided it can't conduct all its business in Erse—because most members don't speak it and the reporting staff can't take it down in shorthand. Eamonn O'Neill, Cork West member for the opposition Fine Gael asked Prime Minister de Valera whether he could devise a scheme by which only those able to conduct Erse's business in the Irish tongue as well as English would be elected. "It is certain that the Gaelicization of the country will not be complete until the business of the Dail is conducted in Irish," de Valera replied. But O'Neill's suggestion would bring complaints of injustice; and persons competent to report verbatim in Irish and English were not available, anyway. The matter was dropped.

## WAGING BATTLE ON HAIR SEALS

LADNER —The Board of Trade of Ladner, 18 miles south of Vancouver, has appealed to the Fisheries Department for aid in the war on hair seals, destroyers of salmon in the Fraser River.

Nicholas Stevens, fish buyer, told the meeting that of 100,000 salmon he bought last season, 3,000 had been damaged by seals. Seals get into nets with the fish and tear pieces out of the trapped salmon.

Ladner fishermen have bought a special net and rifle ammunition to combat the mammals which congregate in Fraser River sloughs. Exact number killed cannot be determined as bodies sink immediately after being shot.

## New Installation In 'Phone Exchange

A product of the ingenuity of the Assistant Telephone Superintendent F. M. Kempton, a new chief operator's desk has been set up in the city telephone exchange. The instrument will facilitate and simplify operating procedures in the telephone nerve centre. The new desk, made from the former private exchange at the Canadian Fish and Cold Storage Co. plant, at Seal Cove, was wired for its present use by Mr. Kempton, who spent considerable time on its technical construction. Sitting at the desk, Chief Operator Miss Elita Johnson can monitor calls and provide information to subscribers with more facility than formerly.




## AWAIT TOURIST ROOM


