PLANS LAID FOR AUXILIAY GYMNASIUM

Roosevelt Park building will be used in construction of the new gymnasium wing, and proceeds from saleable material will offset the original \$5,000 purchase price of the building which was bought from War Assets a year ago. The original purchase price also included \$2,000 worth of valuable equipment.

Last night's decision of the board of directors centred round the need for gymnasium accommodation for specialized groups at the Civic Centre. Many of these groups, the board felt all in number and could the auxiliary gym, while large classes and spectators ports could use the main gym.

The new unit will be 55 feet ing and 31 feet wide, and from the standpoint of heating and Terrace eneral maintenance, will be an integral part of the main Civic Centre building. Civic Centre staff also will supervise activi-

Injured are Michael Luchak, Pat Boyle, Lin Yuan, Sam Wiggins and Barry Halliday.


