METLAKATLA — An invasion by a Port Simpson girls' basketball team was repulsed Friday night by the Metlakatla Cubs who overwhelmed the visitors by a score of 35-10 in a one-sided encounter that favored the home team from the start, despite constant rallies by Port Simpson. A return match is planned shortly at Port Simpson.

Snowed under from the start, the Port Simpson girls sustained a fast pace right to the final whistle even though most of their shots missed the basket. The Metlakatla lassies showed consistent accuracy that widened their lead in each quarter.
