KITSEGUCLA — Funeral services for Peter Milton, Kitsegukla patriarch who died recently at the age of 97, were conducted here recently by Rev. Robert Morris. Deceased started what was believed to be the first transport on the Skeena River, freighting between the coast and upper Skeena in a canoe. He was a friend of the late Rev. Thomas Crosby and Rev. W. H. Pierce, now living in Prince Rupert, when they were missionaries on the Skeena. He

was known for his devotion to Christian living and once built a squared log church on the Carnaby Indian reserve.

He is survived by two sons, George and William, and a sister, Mrs. Fanny Milton. There are also a number of other relatives.

Pallbearers were Tom Moore, Samuel Sampare, Wilfred Weget, David Williams, Ernest Hyzimes and Morris Williams.
