"VAN" FINDS RUPERT BEST

Tanned by the summer sun of Australia, R. G. Van der Sluys, local businessman, stepped jauntily down the gangplank of the Prince Rupert yesterday firmly convinced that he had returned to the best place in the world.

"Take my word for it," he said earnestly, as raindrops glistened on his face that only a few hours before had felt the caress of the sun of Hawaii and other antipodean pinpoints, "Prince Rupert is the best place I have seen in over 16,000 miles of travel."

"Van" boarded the Prince Rupert Wednesday night, after arriving in Vancouver from Sydney which he left on Sunday morning—47 hours before—on an Australian National Airways plane. He spent 12 hours in Honolulu en route.

He made the trip by plane both ways, leaving Prince Rupert late in January. Australia, his homeland, he indicated, has its disadvantages. One of them is the queue method of merchandising which, he said, eats up endless hours of the peoples' time.
