Timely Recipe

One cup left-over meat; one teaspoon minced onion; two tablespoons fat; two half-inch slices soft bread; 1½ cups hot milk; two eggs, one-half teaspoon salt; one-quarter teaspoon paprika; one cup thinly sliced cheese; one tablespoonful fat; one tablespoon minced parsley.

Put meat and onion through grinder. Pan fry for three minutes with the two tablespoons fat. Arrange in bottom of baking dish. Break bread into small pieces. Cut cheese, beaten egg yolks and hot milk. Add remaining fat, parsley, salt and paprika. Let stand 20 minutes or until ready to bake and then fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Pour into baking dish over meat and over-panch in a moderate oven until set—about 45 minutes. This amount serves four or five persons.

IS APPOINTED TO CONVENTION

Mrs. J. H. Black Named to Attend P. T. Gathering in New Brunswick

At the Prince Rupert Parent-Teacher council meeting held in the Civic Centre on Monday night, Mrs. J. H. Black disclosed that she had received notification that the executive committee of the Provincial Federation had elected her as the northern representative to the national convention to be held this coming August in Sackville, New Brunswick. There are five representatives from British Columbia, appointed geographically.

Mrs. Black also gave a lively report on some aspects of the provincial convention held in Victoria during April, which she attended as an unofficial delegate.

A resolution was read from the Borden Street School requesting that the Council write the B.C. Dental Association notifying them of the shortage of dentists in Prince Rupert and asking their co-operation in obtaining more dentists. The resolution was supported by the other Parent-Teacher Associations and the Council moved to comply with the request.

Gradually stir in sifted dry ingredients; beat with spoon until smooth. Add extracts, raisins; stir to blend. Bake in greased, lightly floured 9" x 5" x 3" pan at 300°F. for 2 hours.
