CO-OP UPSETS MOTORS 13-9

Waterfront Nine Win from Last Year's Champions

In one of the major upsets of the early season, Co-op planted a 13-9 defeat on the General Motors at Gyro Park Monday night. Motors ground along in low gear, backing frequently with errors which gave Co-op ample opportunity to score. Motors' darkest hour was in the fifth inning when they committed five errors.

The game was featured by some good pitching by Slater, good fielding by Morgan but no fewer than 27 errors. For Co-op it was a well-deserved win over last year's champions.

The Co-op team was never headed. Their battery of Slater and Whytenbrock was impressive. Slater had a two-bagger and a single while Whytenbrock hit a three-bagger and a single. Ward, with two two-baggers and a single, and Postulo, with a two-bagger and two singles, hit well. Slater struck out two, gave up one walk and allowed only six hits.

Ted Arney struck out four, gave up one walk but was hit for fourteen safeties. His teammates were much below form as they made 14 errors; seven of them in the sixth. Lambie hit a grand two-bagger and Simonson also had a two-bagger though the latter's fielding was much below his usual standard. Morgan hit two singles and in one inning took three catches that related the opposition.
