## TRIBUTE TO HIS WORTH

Impressive Rites Yesterday  
Afternoon for Late J. J. Little

It was a long way from the shops of Scotland to an important executive position in this country but the man whose loss was mourned had accomplished this and thereby proven himself a skillful workman and a competent executive, said Rev. A. F. MacSween in paying tribute from his pulpit yesterday afternoon at the funeral service for the late J. J. Little, vice-president and general manager of the Northern British Columbia Power Co. Mr. MacSween also referred to the important part that Mr. Little had paid in various phases of community and social life. The large congregation comprising leaders in civic and business life, his staff and employees, his Masonic brethren, comrades of the First Great War and citizens at large was fitting testimonial to his worth and the esteem in which deceased was held.

The church was filled to capacity, Masons, Rotarians, Canadian Legion members and Northern British Columbia Power Co. employees attending in groups.

Mrs. E. J. Smith presided at the organ and hymns were "Unto the Hills" and "Abide With Me."

Following the service, a long concourse proceeded to Fairview Cemetery where interment was made in the Masonic plot with rites of Tsimpssean Lodge led by Robert Cameron, worshipful master. As the casket was lowered to the final resting place, "Last Post" was solemnly sounded by Bugler W. J. Rance.

Honorary pallbearers, were Arthur Brooksbank, S. E. Parker, W. O. Fulton, H. T. Lock, Dr. L. W. Kergin and F. M. Good. Active pallbearers were R. E. Benson, James Forman, Arnold Flaten, J. L. Lee, J. H. McLeod and Frank Ditt.


