HOW CAN I ???

The Prince Rupert Basketball Association will close out a very successful season with a two-game total point series with the New Metlakatla, Alaska, Vets, this year's winners of the Ketchikan City League Championship.

The Vets are reported to boast of a strong line-up, probably the strongest seen here this season. Team personnel includes David, high scoring centre; Brendable, former University of Oregon forward; the Atkinson brothers, veteran Alaska forwards; Hudson, Leask and Frank and Bill Hayward.

The Rupert All-Stars have won three series so far this season, against Vancouver Arrows, Ketchikan All-Stars and New Metlakatla Athletics.

To finish their season undefeated on the local court, MacPhee and Co. will have to get by the Vets and then they will feel confident that, when they board the steamer Monday next for Port Alberni, they will be taking an undefeated team and will have a better than even chance to cop the Senior "B" British Columbia championship.

The Rupert All-Stars have had to depend on the more experienced playing of MacPhee, Lindsay, Beynon, Morgan, Dominato and Fitch to carry the load in the former series but it is expected that the Holkestad brothers, Forman and Davis will be able to do their share during the coming series.

The All-Stars are hoping for an undefeated season but, if any team is to shatter this hope, it will probably be the Metlakatla Vets.

DAMAGE CLAIM IN EXCHEQUER IS ADJOURNED

In Exchequer court here this morning, Mr. Justice J. T. Thorson adjourned until the fall session of the court a claim by Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Stone for damages against the Dominion government arising out of an automobile accident in 1944.

The plaintiffs are seeking damages for costs resulting from an arm injury received by Mrs. Stone while riding in an army jeep on August 5, 1944, when a passing military truck struck her elbow, injuring it severely.

The adjournment is the second which the case has received since the claim was laid a year ago.

T. W. Brown, counsel for Mr. and Mrs. Stone requested the adjournment which was agreed to by C. L. MacAlpine, of Vancouver, counsel for the government.

Damages in excess of \$10,000 are being sought.

"T'WAS A GREAT NIGHT FOR APPS AND BRODA—Jubilant congratulations were exchanged by two Toronto Maple Leaf players, Turk Broda (left) and Captain Syl Apps (right), after the Leafs had whipped the Detroit Red Wings in Detroit in the last game of the current N.H.L. schedule. The victory in itself was an anti-climax, for the Leafs had clinched the N.H.L. championship the night before. But two individual achievements stood out. Broda's excellent goalkeeping won him the Vezina Trophy. He won it by a margin of five goals, 143 to 148, over Detroit's goalie, Harry Lumley. Captain Syl Apps, who has said that he will retire at the end of this season, realized his heart's desire when he scored three goals to bring his lifetime total to 201. Funny, hat Broda commented before the two week-end games: "I hope that Apps don't retire. He's been my meal ticket for 10 years. When things look rugged, Hap drops him over the boards and the situation improves instantly." And Broda knows whereof he speaks. The Maple Leafs and Red Wings start the Stanley Cup final tonight.
