ADAM McINTOSH DIES AT HOME

Former Well Known Railway Employee Passes Away

Adam McIntosh, a resident of Prince Rupert since 1919 and a former employee of the Grand Trunk Pacific and Canadian National Railways, died at his home at 733 Sixth Avenue West Wednesday evening at the age of 54 after a long illness.

Victim of a stroke in September, 1945, Mr. McIntosh had been confined to bed since that time. He was born at Aberdeen, Scotland, and came to Canada in 1910.

Settling in Winnipeg after his arrival in Canada, he worked as a log scaler in the Grandview district, then moved to Brandon where he entered the ticket office of the Grand Trunk Pacific. In Brandon in 1912 he married Miss Margaret Rose who survives him. There is one son, Percy, who grew up in Prince Rupert and is now living in Vancouver. He is expected here on this afternoon's plane.

In 1919, Mr. McIntosh moved to Prince Rupert with Canadian National Railways. He started here as clerk in the city freight office, then was promoted to accountant and finally chief clerk. He was a popular and highly respected member of the staff.

Deceased was a life member of the Aberdeen Masonic Lodge but took no active part in Masonic activities after leaving Scotland. A niece, Miss Cathie Creighton, survives him in the Old Country.

Funeral arrangements will be announced later.

Timely Recipe

TOMATO JUICE

HOT PACK METHOD—Wash tomatoes, remove core, cut into pieces but do not peel. Bring to boil and boil, covered, 5 minutes. Press through sieve or purer. Bring juice to boiling point. Pour into containers, leaving headspace. Add 1 teaspoon salt per quart. Process sealers or cans 15 minutes in the boiling water bath. Glass sealers may be processed in a thermostatically controlled oven at 275 degrees F. for 20 minutes. Tin cans must never be processed in the oven.

SYDNEY IS SHORT GRAVE-DIGGERS

SYDNEY—Sydney grave-diggers are a dying race. Undertakers say that they have so much difficulty in getting laborers to dig graves that they fear there will be an end to burials in Sydney within a few years. People will have to be cremated regardless of their religious beliefs, according to one leading undertaker. He told a reporter that his firm now embalmed all bodies because of frequent delays in the cemeteries. Labor shortage has held up funerals for days and a number of funerals have been diverted from one cemetery to another. Undertakers predict a small fortune for anyone who invents a mechanical grave digger.

Didn't Evade Draft, Was Adrift On Raft

WELLINGTON, N.Z.—Brought before a court here for failure to report for military service in 1942, Frank Miles, 41, said he was unable to do so because at the time he should have reported he was adrift on a raft in the Atlantic.

Evidence showed his ship was sunk under him while serving in the Atlantic at the time he was called for service in New Zealand.

"Technically he did not report, but it is nonsensical that this action should have been against him," said the magistrate in dismissing the case.


