A missionary rally was held in First Baptist Church Wednesday evening with Eldon Whipple of the China Inland Mission and Rev. V. E. Brace of the Orinoco River Mission, Venezuela, South America, as guest speakers. Both are secretaries for their respective missions in this area.

These two missions are inter-denominational and so was the audience but the warm spirit of oneness in Christ throughout the service was evident in the singing of the much loved hymns. Mr. Whipple who is a business man, is also an accomplished musician. He delighted the audience with a piano arrangement of his own—a medley of such beautiful strains as "Finlandia," "Jesus Lover of My Soul" and "What a Friend we Have in Jesus."

Mr. Whipple told in a few words the story of how God moved in the man, Hudson Taylor, to found the China Inland Mission and how, through one hundred years, the power of God moved through the prayers of His people.

Mr. Brace told vividly of the founding of the Orinoco River Mission through prayer and the mighty hand of God. The joy of living in the will and guidance of God permeated the whole story.

Beautiful colored slides of the work in Venezuela showed the eagerness and seriousness of the crowds of people who are seeking God.

CIVIC CENTRE MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

The Civic Centre's annual membership drive this year will take the form of an appeal through the mails, rather than a house-to-house canvass, Don Forward, Civic Centre managing secretary, told a meeting of the Junior Chamber of Commerce last night.

In a brief address, Mr. Forward outlined plans for the drive, explained the facilities available to members and appealed for whole-hearted support for the community centre.

"We are mailing out 2,500 brochures describing the Civic Centre and the things it has to offer," Mr. Forward said. "That makes everyone a canvasser in his own home and that's the way we want it. We need your support."

Each brochure has an application form attached, which only need be filled out and returned to the Civic Centre, he explained. Payment of membership fees can be arranged on a time basis which will have only a slight effect on any budget.

Roland Miles, new recreational director, outlined the recreational programs that have been planned, assuring the Junior Chamber members that "we intend to have handicrafts for everyone—from the cradle to the grave."

In its widely varied recreational program, the Civic Cen-

tre staff plans to rely on a good deal of volunteer help, which will give the enterprises a true community spirit, he said.
