minute, 45 seconds. Monitors from the older classes immediately went to the smaller grades and assisted the tiny children to leave the building while others closed all windows.

As the last student left the building, older boys closed the doors.

"It is safety, not speed that we stress here," said Principal J. S. Wilson. His 210 pupils apparently had both.

King Edward, another two-storey public school, was cleared of its 280 children in one minute and 20 seconds. Here, no students bothered to close windows, as Principal R. G. Moore put it: "The windows are loose in the frames and they are difficult to close. I don't want to have any child trapped in a room while he tries to close a window."

At bungalow-type Conrad Street school, where the six classrooms house 209 pupils from grades one to five, the clearing time was one minute even. Classroom processions were notably orderly and the children lined up at both ends of the long building.

At Booth Memorial High School, Principal A. M. Hurst was given a few seconds warning and immediately dashed for a stop watch. His resulting calculations set the time at one minute, 37 seconds to clear the big brick and plaster building of its 460 students.

Following each of the fire drills, Chief Lock addressed the assembled student bodies briefly on the importance of fire prevention.

He told them that last year, 15,000 fires in Canada had done damage totalling millions of dollars and that they had claimed 390 Canadian lives, 194 of them children.

He asked them to make sure that their homes were free of inflammable rubbish and not to play with matches.

Fire Prevention Week is observed in early October, he said, because it commemorates the great Chicago fire of 1871 in which more than 300 people died. This, like other holocausts, resulted from carelessness.

"Carelessness," he re-interated, "is the greatest single cause of fire, and can only be overcome by intelligent use and control of fire."

Seasonable Ideas for Housekeepers

ANCIENT SQUASH COME IN MANY VARIETIES — APPETIZING FOOD

Gourds were probably the most useful plant of early civilization. Among the numerous types some were used for kitchen utensils, others for ornament and a great many for food.

Among the edible gourds there is great variety. Some of these are squashes and pumpkins. Early squash usually have pale colored and juicy flesh and are often used when immature. These include vegetable marrows and summer squash, such as patty pans, zucchini and yellow crook necks. Nature keeps the best until the last when growing squash. The yellow fleshed fall varieties of squash and pumpkin have a fuller flavor and smoother texture than the earlier types and have the added advantage of keeping for several months if carefully stored.

Home economists say that even the best squash must have proper handling in the kitchen to produce that just-right dry fluffiness and rich flavor.

There are many ways of cooking and serving squash and they are equally good, when seasoned, as a vegetable or sweetened and spiced for a dessert.

Squash Bake
6 cups sliced squash
½ teaspoon salt

1/8 teaspoon pepper
2 tablespoons butter
2 tablespoons sugar
1 teaspoon minced parsley
½ cup milk
Peel and slice squash, remove the seeds. Cut in 1-inch pieces. Place in a well-greased baking dish. Sprinkle with salt and pepper and dot with butter. Cover and bake in a moderate 325 degree F. oven for 45 minutes. Remove cover and sprinkle with sugar and parsley, add milk and continue baking, uncovered for 20 minutes. Yield: six servings.

Squash Pudding
2 cups cooked, mashed squash
2 cups milk
2 eggs
¾ cup brown sugar
2 tablespoons butter, melted
¼ teaspoon ginger
½ teaspoon cinnamon
1/8 teaspoon nutmeg
½ teaspoon salt
½ cup raisins
Mix squash with milk, strain, add well beaten egg, sugar, melted butter, spices and raisins. Beat well. Pour into a greased baking dish, and oven-poach in a moderate oven, 350 degrees F. for 45 minutes or until set. Chill. Yield: six servings.

Squash Goulash
4 slices bacon
½ cup sliced onion

6 cups peeled, sliced squash
1 green pepper
2 cups fresh or canned tomatoes
1 ½ cup teaspoon salt
1/8 teaspoon pepper
1 teaspoon sugar
Cut bacon slices in 1-inch pieces, fry until crisp. Add onion, sliced squash, green pepper, tomatoes, salt, pepper and sugar. Cover and cook slowly 25 minutes, stirring occasionally. Yield: six servings.

HOW CAN I ???

Q. Can I keep parsley during the winter months?

A. If a good sized flower pot is kept filled with growing parsley in the kitchen during the winter months, it will always be ready and convenient for seasoning and garnishing.

Q. How can I treat a rag rug that has been washed, so that it will lie flat on the floor?

A. Try starching it somewhat heavily. This will make it lie flat, it will keep clean longer and will be much easier to wash next time.

Q. How can I remove melted wax from the sides of good candles?

A. Try dipping the candles in hot water.

FAMILY IN DIRE NEED

Mrs. Ross Richardson
Appealing For Aid,
Particularly Clothing

The sorry plight of a widowed mother and five children has aroused the interest of Mrs. Ross Richardson, local volunteer welfare worker, who is endeavouring to obtain relief supplies, particularly clothing, on their behalf. At present they are living threadbare and under difficult circumstances in a cold and leaky dwelling with low fuel supply and scanty furniture. Government welfare workers are also interested in the case but any supplementation of what they can do would, Mrs. Richardson says, be of great help in what she declares to be a case of the utmost need.

The father of the family was drowned in a tragedy in the Skeena River last winter. The children include an 18-year-old imbecile boy, a five-year-old boy and three girls, 14, 10 and 8.


