meet the needs of the Army, Navy and Air Force.

ATOMIC BOMB SPECTRE

But in the background looms the spectre of the atom and hydrogen bombs and other new weapons that have increased man's power of destruction to an extent that stuns the imagination.

The average citizen has reason to believe that Britain and her allies have an edge in the atomic armaments race. However, he knows that Russia has made progress in this field — more rapid than at one time seemed likely.

Some authorities state there is no certainty that the new weapons will ever be used should war come. They point to the example of gas and germ warfare that could have been employed with deadly effects in the Second World War.

Meanwhile, a recruiting campaign has been under way for volunteers in the older-age groups to serve as a home defence force. They are being trained by experts who went to Hiroshima and Nagasaki to study the effects of the atom bombs on these Japanese cities and the people who lived in them. The call was for a minimum force of 150,000, but fewer than 40,000 have enrolled to date.

The government has been taken to task for lack of aggressiveness in furthering this phase of the defence program. Its critics charge that the public has been given no information about air-raid shelters or other protection against atomic or rocket missiles, about dispersal and evacuation or signals to be adopted to warn the populace of danger.

Similar complaints were heard during the tense months that preceded the outbreak of the last war.

Claiming there is far too

much "hush-hush" in dealing with defence preparation generally, opposition members in the House of Commons have waged a persistent campaign for a secret session of Parliament to discuss the situation. The pleas have been rejected by the government on the grounds that such discussion, without wartime controls, might endanger national security.

On this point the Daily Mail commented editorially:

"Gloom and despondency about the present situation are as needless as they are foolish. But it would be even worse to behave like ostriches. The world is passing through a highly-dangerous period. The best hope of warding off the worst that could happen is to be ready for it."
