Joe Louis Is In Good Shape

CHICAGO (CP)—The former world's heavyweight boxing champion, Joe Louis, was today pronounced in good shape for his ten-round comeback starter against Cesar Brion at Chicago Stadium November 29. Both Louis and Brion appeared before the Illinois State Athletic Commission yesterday for physical tests.

Eleven years ago a strapping Welsh youngster from Swansea and his pal, a slim Yorkshire lad from Bradford, shuffled dejectedly out of Arsenal Football Club's business office. With them went two battered bags containing their playing kit and shattered hopes. Their bid for a berth with London's famous "Gunners" of the English first division, had been turned down. Although both were then rated as fair prospects, the Arsenal management showed no interest at the nominal signing-on fee of \$30.

Today, the same lads—Trevor Ford and Len Shackleton—are riding the crest of fame and success, but not with "Gunners." As the spearhead of Sunderland's reconstructed forward-line they have become known as the "Golden Boys" of British soccer. The tag is appropriate — they represent a partnership that cost the Durham Club \$150,000.

Acquisition of Ford from Aston Villa was the surprise of the early season. An automatic choice to represent Wales in the all-star international tests, his services had been eagerly sought by several first division clubs, including Chelsea. But Sunderland won out by plunking \$90,000 on the line, an all-time record. Shackleton, acquired from Newcastle United in 1948, came at a comparative bargain price of \$60,000.

In his first game with his new team-mates, Ford came under a glaring spotlight at Stamford Bridge, before more than 50,000 Chelsea supporters. It was a particularly bad day for the man who overnight had become the costliest soccer player in the world. His every move was jeered by the hostile crowd, apparently laboring under the impression he had spurned an enticing offer to join the Chelsea Club. With Ford bottled up on almost every play, Sunderland lost 3-0.
