Film Strips Brings United Nations to Classrooms



Film strips are now being used by teachers and speakers as one of the most practical ways of telling the story of the United Nations to their audiences. The U.N. Department of Public Information has released 15 different subjects explaining the aims, structure and work of the World

Organization. More than 90,000 copies of these are now in use in 62 countries in the five official languages of the U.N.—Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish. Here a class of ten-year-old children listen and look as a teacher shows one of the U.N. film strips mentioned above.

Teacher Talks At Rotary Club

The Prince Rupert Parent-Teachers Council is dealing with a resolution regarding the health of school children, especially the dental problem, said T. G. Bateman, principal of Conrad School, at a Rotary Club luncheon Thursday in an Education Week address.

being supported by other Parent Teacher associations. Mr. Bateman said. Health authorities in Prince Rupert will be approached and asked to conduct a survey of city school children. The principal explained that loss of teeth influences a child's eating habits.

He related to an article he had read in a national magazine referring to a survey being conducted by Dr. D. D. Carpenter in Ontario. A survey had previously been made and the findings indicated that 95 per cent of the children up to the age of five had dental decay. Investigation by the doctor up to the present time, Mr. Bateman related, show that a chemical called flourine present in water reduces decay in teeth. Dental swabbing in a solution of flourine, Mr. Bateman further related, reduced dental decay 49 per cent.

Mr. Bateman pointed out that a great deal of advancement has been made in city schools as a result of P.T.A. work. The organization unites parents and teachers so that a better understanding is developed. "Education takes place through environment", he remarked.

"The P.T.A. is interested in trends of education and this (Rotary) and other organizations have a stimulating effect on the curriculum," Mr. Bateman stated. He referred to differences between schools of today and yesterday. Scholars of yesterday emphasized a great deal of factual knowledge, he said.
